

Invitation for Public Comment

Corrigin Grain Receival Site Expansion, WA, Lots 20 and 21 Corrigin South Road, Corrigin WA, approximately 220km east of the Perth CBD, Co-Operative Bulk Handling Limited (CBH) (EPBC 2021/9024)

Publication of Preliminary Documentation under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act)

The following notice is published pursuant to Section 95A(3) of the EPBC Act.

Co-Operative Bulk Handling Limited (CBH) proposed to clear 1.6 ha of vegetation for the expansion of the proponent's existing Corrigin Grain Receival Site at Lots 20 and 21 Corrigin South Road, Corrigin WA, approximately 220km east of the Perth CBD.

The proposed action was determined to be a controlled action under the EPBC Act with assessment by Preliminary Documentation. The matters protected by a provision of Part 3 of the EPBC Act include:

- Listed threatened species and communities (sections 18 & 18A)

Public comments are invited on Corrigin Grain Receival Site Expansion, WA the Preliminary Documentation. The submission period commences on 22 April 2024 and will close on 6 May 2024.
